CIVIC MEMORIAL AND KIN ATHLETIC PARK INCLUSION NO OVERNIGHT

SHELTER AREAS

PURPOSE:

This report outlines a recommendation to amend the Parks and Public Places Bylaw 5057 to include Civic Memorial Park and Kin Race Track Athletic Park as "no overnight shelter" areas.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT Council amends the Parks and Public Places Bylaw 5057 as outlined in the report titled "Civic Memorial and Kin Athletic Park Inclusion No Overnight Shelter Areas" dated July 26, 2022 and respectfully submitted by the Manager, Long Range Planning and Sustainability.

1. THAT Council receive for information the report titled "Civic Memorial and Kin Athletic Park Inclusion No Overnight Shelter Areas" dated July 26, 2022 and respectfully submitted by the Manager, Long Range Planning and Sustainability.

Note: This would permit overnight sheltering in these two parks.

B. Rationale:

Three amendments are proposed to the Parks and Public Places Bylaw 5057 (Attachment 1). These are to include Civic Memorial and Kin Race Track Athletic Parks in the "no overnight shelter" areas and to add Schedule A to the list of schedules in section 14 (b).

Civic Memorial Park is nearing completion of construction. Administration has received many concerns regarding the potential for sheltering in the park overnight. This park is in the downtown core and is very urbanized and is not considered an appropriate location for overnight sheltering.

The parcel that Kal Tire Place is on prohibits overnight sheltering, however, Kin Race Track Athletic Park was previously not included in the Parks and Public Places Bylaw 5057 due to uncertainties in its legal standing. Now that this has been resolved and planning for the park construction is underway, it seems appropriate to consider including this area as a no overnight shelter area. This would reduce conflicts between construction and those potentially sheltering in the park.

One additional amendment has been included to add Schedule A to the list of schedules in section 14 (b). This was an oversight and is considered a minor housekeeping change.

in a manner that is liable to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of individuals or the public in a public place.

13. Unless otherwise authorized under section 14 of this Bylaw, no person shall at any time construct, install, erect, place or occupy in any Public Place a temporary shelter, structure, improvement or work of any nature, or sleep in a public place.

(Bylaw 5637)

Erecting Structures

- 14. (a) Subject to Section 14(b), no person may erect, construct, or build, or cause to be erected, constructed, or built, in or on any Park any tent, building, shelter, pavilion, or other construction whatsoever without the prior written permission of the Parks Manager. In determining whether to grant permission, the Parks Manager may consider the matters set out in Section 15.
 - (b) Notwithstanding Section 14(a), where there is no accessible shelter accommodation available in the City, a Homeless Person may, without the prior written permission of the Parks Manager, as set out in Section 14(a), erect and occupy a Temporary Shelter in a Park, except in those Parks listed in Schedules "A", "B", "C", "D", "E" and "F" (Linear Park effective February 1, 2018) and "F" of this Bylaw, between the hours of dusk on one day and 9:00 a.m. of the following day, provided that the Homeless Person:
 - (i) not erect the Temporary Shelter until **dusk** on one day; (Bylaw 5652)
 - (ii) dismantle and pack up the Temporary Shelter from the Park prior to **9:00 a.m.** of the following day;
 - (iii) comply with all other provisions of this Bylaw;
