Neuron Local Impact for 2022



of all Neuron trips replaced a car trip



of users believe Neuron has had a positive impact on Vernon

19%

of trips taken on Neuron would not have happened if Neuron was not available



of users find Neuron to be a more affordable mode of transportation



of users have indicated that they make a purchase during their trip



of users use e-scooters to commute



2022 Program Highlights

- Launch of the interactive in-app Scoot Safe Academy to enhance rider education
- Addition of 50 e-bikes to the fleet
- Increase of e-scooter fleet to 350 to meet demand in Vernon this year
- Expanded riding area to better serve residents that use Neuron as primary mode of transportation





Riding area expansion



 In addition to the expansion late last year into East Hill and Bella Vista, we have continued to optimize our service area this year by expanding the Okanagan Landing area.



Safety Update

- In total, 9 'slow riding', 12 'no riding' and 29 'no parking' zones have been implemented in collaboration with the City and local stakeholders
- Along with staff, collaborate with local stakeholders to optimize routes for accessibility
- Incentives provided for helmet use and responsible parking practices
- Rider and public education programs continued throughout the operating season
- Ongoing in-app and electronic communication and education on safe riding (e.g. helmet use, age requirements, one person per e-scooter)
