- Community Adult Organizations must have a membership of eighty (80) percent Vernon Resident Pass holders to qualify for a ten (10) percent discount off the Adult Community Rates approved in the Manual of Fees and Charges;
- 4. Community Youth and Adult Organizations must submit a membership roster seasonally to Recreation Services that lists members names and city/jurisdiction to verify that their membership is made up of eighty (80) percent Vernon Resident Pass holders in order to qualify for discounts. This information will be utilized only for the purpose of which it was collected and in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Privacy Protect Act (FOIPPA).

for a structural change (extension of service area into a golf shop with a person capacity of 50) for Licence Number 147391 held by Predator Ridge Golf Resort located at 301 Village Centre Place (Rem Lot 5, Plan KAP65635, Section 2, Township 13, ODYD) as outlined in the report titled "Predator Ridge Golf Resort – Application for a Structural Change" dated March 12, 2024 and respectfully submitted by the Planner II, based on the following reasons:

- The subject property is zoned C10A Tourist Commercial and Residential. It is located at 301 Village Centre Place, adjacent to Resort Commercial/Residential and Park properties. The zone permits the golf course clubhouse and liquor primary use;
- The subject property is designated Tourist Commercial in the Official Community Plan and is located within the Predator Ridge Neighbourhood Plan Area. The subject use is compatible with existing and potential surrounding uses for the area;
- The subject property is adequately served with on-site parking.
 Traffic in the area is not expected to be impacted by the proposed structural change. Similarly, noise in the area is not expected to change due to the proposed structural change;
- The RCMP and Bylaw Compliance have indicated that the proposed structural change at Predator Ridge Golf Resort does not present any policing concerns; and
- All owners and occupiers of lands and businesses operating within a 60m radius of the subject property were notified of the application, and were provided the opportunity to submit comments to the City. A total of 542 property owners and occupiers, including businesses, were contacted. A Notice of Intent requesting public input was published in the February 29 and March 7, 2024 editions of the Vernon Morning Star newspaper. Two comments from the public were received by the response deadline, both in support of the application;

AND FURTHER, that the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch be advised that Council is in support of the subject amendment to the liquor licence application as it addresses the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch criteria in the following manner:

- Noise in the area is not expected to change due to the proposed structural change;
- The Predator Ridge Golf Resort clubhouse building has been in operation for over 30 years. The proposed structural change is not expected to negatively impact the community; and

 It is not anticipated that a proposed structural change would result in Predator Ridge Golf Resort, located at 301 Village Centre Place (Rem Lot 5, Plan KAP65635, Section 2, Township 13, ODYD), being operated in a manner that is contrary to its primary purpose of a golf course clubhouse.
