



Identified Gaps: Homelessness



- Shelter, Supported Housing, Complex Care, Affordable Market Housing.
- Warm Spaces to Hang Out:
 - Mornings and Evenings (Particularly from Friday to Sunday) and on Statutory Holidays.
- Shower and laundry services are limited to weekdays.
- Public Washrooms close overnight.
- Storage for belongings during the day.
- Security concerns in public spaces overnight, particularly Polson Park.



Challenges, Strengths and Opportunities: Homelessness

Challenge:

 Lack of consistent and easily accessible funding for cold weather planning

Strengths:

- Community partnerships and collaboration
- Community donations of cold weather supplies

Opportunities:

 Community partners expanding services during the winter months and/or during extreme weather events
